Live out the love of the Lord: (John 13:35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.)



in the Lord

"A man speaks of his heart-felt words on his deathbed."

This phrase is often used to describe the importance of the final words spoken by those who are about to leave this world. Truths that are beneficial, earnest and closest to the heart.

In 2013, right before his passing on, the late Elder George Ong repeatedly urge members of Church of Singapore (Harvest) to stay united. He also requested for a message on the "Unity in the Lord" to be preached during the Worship Service. The late Elder George Ong knew that unity among the members is pivotal to the future of the church when faced with challenging situations. As he departed, the members sang "Love Overflows" - love and unity are inseparable.

John 17 records Jesus' last prayer before His arrest; that being the last indicates its significance. In verses 20-25, Jesus prayed specifically for believers, mentioning unity and love. The following 3 points are what we should take note of in these verses:



Jesus mentioned 'be one' four times, leaving little doubt that we are to be one in Christ. When an archer takes aim, he focuses only on his target and the rest of his surrounding becomes blurred and of no concern. In the same way, when we are one with the Lord, we focus and look only on Jesus, not caring how others view or think of us. We focus only on our fellowship with our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ and how our unity can glorify the name of the Lord.

Church of Singapore is a very unique church. We have more than ten different Worship Services, each catering to different languages and demographics. This may cause misunderstanding and dissatisfaction to arise between coworkers, and unwittingly causing hurt. However, when we focus on Christ, we are able to exercise tolerance and acceptance for one another. We learn to pray for one another as we continue to fight the good fight for the Lord.

Let us strive for the same goal regardless of which Worship Service we belong to; doing our best individually with our God-given gifts and working together to build the body of Christ to glorify Lord Jesus, such that we may see the glory of God and the revival coming upon us.

Church of Singapore is a local church. We believe that every brother or sister is equal before God. Everyone is a royal priest with his/her own important function. When the church faces challenges, we can overcome it by





Verses 23 and 24 also mention that we are not only to know that God loves us as He loves Jesus, but we are also to let this powerful love of God to manifest among brothers and sisters in Christ.

This is an emphasis on God's love for us. We can only love one another when we know and deeply sense how much God loves us. The apostle John did not just mention of his love for the Lord in his epistles, but also about him being a disciple whom Jesus loves. It is through these thoughts that we understand John's closeness to the Lord. Shall we not also tell ourselves that we are God's beloved? I suggest that you stand before a mirror every morning when you start your day, and say to yourself that "I am (name), whom God loves." When we have such revelation and understanding, we will naturally let love flow through us. With this love shed abroad through the unity of our brothers and sisters in Christ, we will be able to look beyond the needs of our church and generation, and cast a wider perspective on the impact and influence we can have on the community.

One of the biggest crises in the church is paying lip-service to loving one other, and not sincerely allowing God's love to flow through our words and actions. It is only through the impetus of love that we can purposefully unite the generations to do the Lord's work. Hence, I look forward to seeing the youths serve in dialect services and continuing the work of the dialect services. I also look forward to meaningful interactions as a result of our older generation reaching out to and encouraging our youths.

Verse 20 says that "the world will know that You have sent me". When we are as one, there is love at work within us. Others will be able to see that God has sent us, and the church can bring many to experience the power and redemption of Jesus.

According to a survey conducted in 2020, the percentage increase of Christians in Singapore's population from 2010 to 2020 is negligible. It is also of concern that there is a decline in the percentage of Christian youths. Is this not a problem that our church is facing - an ageing population with a low number of youths that has resulted in stagnation of our numbers in worship services over the last decade.

seeking the Lord in unity, partnering with one other in humility, gentleness and patience, and actively rescuing lost souls.

Our church's sub themes include "Uniting Generations" and "Transforming Communities". The ultimate goal of transformation in the community is to lead people to Christ. But when we do this, satan is also working hard to prevent people from coming to the Lord. At the same time, he will seek to distract the focus of believers with problems within the church and in the world and as a result of which people will turn away and leave the church. We need to recognise we only have

one common enemy - satan the devil. Our battle is akin to fighting a war, and no country can win if her people are divided. Therefore, let us put aside all our prejudices and become one in love, so that we may overcome the devil's tricks and lead others to Christ, and establish a strong church headed by the Lord Jesus Christ in the name of the King of kings and the Lord of lords.

Church Theme Seminar Strengthening our Family Church

We have entered the second year of our theme "Strengthening our Family Church" and our annual church theme seminar was held on-site and streamed live on 12 June 2021.

This year, we introduced a new segment which featured an 8-minute video capturing the views of our members across services, ministries and demographic groups. It was heartening to hear how their experience and spiritual growth resonated with the church theme. One member's sharing about his experience growing up and worshipping with 3 generations of his family in COS really struck a chord with me.

During the Church Theme seminar, Sis Janette Chong (Bilingual Service) shared about *Loving God*, while father and son duo Bro Daniel Foo (Cantonese Service) and Bro Samson Hu (Teens for Christ) shared about *Uniting Generations*, and Bro Isaac Low (English Service) shared about *Transforming Communities*. They were assisted by Bro Samuel Yeong who served as interpreter.

The seminar was very well-received as our members appreciated the practical approach in living out

our church theme, as well as the anecdotes shared by our speakers. A special video prepared by our mission point in Tanjung Pinang was especially impactful as it provided insights on how our partnership with the mission point had transformed their community.

In the middle of 2020, Singapore went into a circuit breaker to curb the spread of COVID-19. It was the first time we experienced a full-scale national 'lockdown' where schools and retail shops were closed, and workers in non-essential businesses were made to work from home. With almost everyone being forced to stay home, it was the perfect opportunity to start a Bible reading challenge for our members in Bilingual Service.

The Bible Reading Challenge was launched on 15 June 2020. Members who participated in the challenge met together every weekday morning (over zoom) and read the Bible in chronological order over a span of 52 weeks. A total of 218 people signed up and an average of 40 participated in the daily morning devotional reading.

The objective of the challenge was simply to cultivate a habit of reading the Bible daily. But the more we read, the more we are enlightened and eager to find out more. What began as half-hour

reading sessions daily soon expanded into a 2-hour scripture exposition and sharing. We were initially apprehensive that the morning devotional reading would not last more than a month, but much to everyone's surprise, we completed the full 52 weeks. Going through this challenge as a community made the tedious passages bearable and difficult ones comprehensible. Scripture also sprang to life as we connected through testimonies.

God speaks through His written Word and it is the most common channel of communication. Rather than be defeated by the pandemic and periods of isolation, we can look back triumphantly and declare as Jesus said in Mt 4:4 that 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'.

Creative Arts Camp 2021 was no ordinary camp as it was the first Creative Arts Camp held after a 2-year hiatus due to the pandemic. For the first time, the camp was held completely online. Our campers aged between 9 and 14 years, participated in praise and worship, devotions, games, and learnt how to play musical instruments, all from the comfort and safety of their own homes. We used "BandLab", an online platform, to teach the participants the basics of worshipping through the keyboard, guitar, bass and drums.

The camp theme, 'Living Water', was aptly named as the camp committee wanted this camp to serve as a testimony that worship is not restricted by physical boundaries. Just as in John 4:21 where Jesus told the Samaritan woman that with the Holy Spirit living in her, she would not need to go to the mountain or temple to worship as long as she worshipped "in Spirit and in Truth". We wanted the campers to know that the heart of worship is about their relationship with Christ every day and not bound to being physically in church.

In relation to worship, we also taught the campers that there are many forms of worship, including using musical instruments or bringing others into a time of worship. With this exposure, we hope that an interest has been forged in learning to play musical instruments and that the next generation will be motivated to use their talents to serve Christ!

In Eph 4:11-16 and 1Thes 5:11-15, Paul addressed churches as a body and as a collective that builds each other up in love and Christlike maturity with some called to preach and some to teach - yet all are to build. Everyone is called to equip, not just those with a larger platform or audience. As we are being equipped, we too are to equip others by encouraging, acknowledging, admonishing, warning, and being patient in love.



A good question to ask ourselves would then be: As we are being equipped, how are we equipping others?

Tung Ling Community Service

The pandemic has uncovered in many areas, social inequities that have grown so significantly that there is a need for deep transformation. Below are 2 new initiatives through which we transform the community for God's glory.

Tung Ling Shelter - Home of Rough Sleepers

When the COVID-19 situation worsened, the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) were concerned of the vulnerability of those without a roof over their heads. To ease their plight, MSF reached out to religious organisations to provide temporary shelter whilst more permanent accommodation could be sought.

When COS became aware of this need, our church leaders gave the approval to convert parts of the church - mainly the basement car park and fellowship area, into a temporary shelter for the rough sleepers. It was also an excellent way to utilise the church premises as Worship Services and church activities could not be held physically during that time.

Operating Tung Ling Shelter has opened our eyes to the experience of the rough sleepers/homeless in Singapore. In a country where the majority of her residents are owners of individual property, interactions with the rough sleepers/homeless are few. We noticed that oftentimes, many are in this plight as a result of deep-rooted family issues,

being dealt with unfortunate circumstances or falling through the cracks in our system.

Running the shelter has had its fair share of ups and downs. There were the occasional minor disputes and incidents with several "uncooperative" stayers. But we also have had success stories such as the reconciliation between a father and son, stayers who have gotten along so well that they have applied for and successfully obtained joint rental housing together, and one who managed to get back on his feet after we helped him with the initial set-up required to be a delivery rider. We have had one who accepted Christ and received salvation. Praise the Lord!

The needs in our community are many and operating Tung Ling Shelter is one way we can impact and transform the community. It is our prayer that more will step forward to serve as it is more blessed to give than to receive.

Tung Ling Counselling Centre - Hope for the Downhearted

In March 2020, a group of Counsellors and Psychologists from COS gathered to have a brainstorming session to explore the possibility of starting a Counselling Ministry in COS. There were many great ideas and much excitement, but shortly after, Singapore was hit by COVID-19 and all plans had to be temporarily shelved.

However as time went by, the stress of living in a prolonged pandemic put a visible strain on the mental and emotional well-being of many people. The church leadership recognised a need to restart this conversation quickly, as the need for professional yet affordable mental health services grew in our community.

Parallel to this, God in His divine plan had been raising up more Counsellors within the COS Family. In the past two years, many COS members began to pursue training in Counselling, though they were unaware that conversations to launch a Counselling ministry were in the works.

As we witnessed God moving ahead of us in preparing the Human Resources necessary for this work, the church's Elder Board gave their full support to this ministry, and Tung Ling Counselling Centre was officially launched in July 2021.

Tung Ling Counselling Centre (TLCC) seeks to bless our community through holistic restoration of the individual - both emotionally and mentally - by means of competent counselling and genuine care. TLCC offers free clinical counselling to anyone who needs it, regardless of faith, gender, or ethnicity.

After just six months of operation, TLCC continues to grow in its capacity and reach. We now have a team of six counsellors who are able to provide counselling both online and in-person. In 2022, TLCC is actively making connections with government agencies and other social service agencies, offering our services to anyone who needs it. We are excited to witness how God continues to move, and pray that we will be faithful and courageous in following His lead.

The Pulpit Committee has recommended the sermon series from the Book of Ruth for our Church Theme in H1 of 2022. The Book of Ruth narrates the stories of Naomi, Ruth and Boaz in the Hebrew community which can be adapted to illustrate our Church's three sub-themes on Loving God, Uniting Generations and Transforming Communities.

The central theme of the book is about **hesed** (**Hebrew word for loving kindness**). Hesed describes the act of love and loyalty that inspires faithful and compassionate behaviour toward another person.

Ruth, Naomi and Boaz experienced the hesed of God and in turn showed hesed to others.

- **1.** The *hesed* of Ruth for her mother-in-law Naomi led Ruth to cling on to Naomi and to embrace her God and her people.
- 2. The *hesed* of Boaz together with his workers led them to show kindness and favour to embrace a foreigner Ruth. It was a beautiful story of loving kindness, faithfulness and loyalty begetting the same. Ruth, a widow and foreigner was described in Ruth 4:15 as a blessing to her mother-in-law and the Hebrew community and their future generations.
- **3.** The *hesed* of God, from God and for God can and must compel us to love one another. It can and must unite members of different generations through fostering respect, honour, commitment and relationships among us. It can and must propel us to help and serve the weak and needy in our church and the community.

What is something we can do to show *hesed* to honour and build up one another in our life groups and church, young and old? What is something we can do to show hesed to help and serve the needy?

In 2013, I left Church of Singapore to help serve in a newly started church. It was a fulfilling and joyful time ministering to mainly new believers.

Sister Chng is over 70 years old and she has been troubled by many pains, and is greatly weakened in health. It has been more than a year since she was bedridden, being unable to open her eyes most of the time.

In Nov 2020, she kept pleading with her family to bring her to church. Her only wish whenever she is lucid is to go to church - wishing to attend Worship Service on-site at least once more before she passes on.

When the church was able to have 50 persons on-site for Worship Services, Sis Chng requested to be brought to church unceasingly. However, her family members were concerned over her weakened state and hesitated bringing her to church. But they conceded after seeing her desperate pleas and arranged to bring her to church on Tuesday 10 November 2020.

When she came, Sis Chng sat in her wheelchair conscious, but with her eyes shut as she soaked in the atmosphere of Worship. Despite knowing that she could pass on anytime, her greatest longing was to return to church to worship the Lord. Thanks be to our Lord who fulfilled her wish and brought her home to be with Him on 13 November 2020.

Sister Ng Siew Choo contracted COVID-19 in October 2021.

When the outbreak became widespread in Singapore, Sis Siew Choo did not dare leave her house, staying home most of the time. One morning, she went to the market briefly and felt unwell that afternoon. She then tested positive for COVID-19.

Thanks be to the Lord, Sis Siew Choo's condition was mild and she recovered after isolating at home for 10 days.

When on-site Worship Services started, Sis Siew Choo's mindset was to wait first and go later as she felt that the ongoing pandemic was still serious and dangerous. However, she later testified during Worship Service that the joke was on her when she said "Little would I know, God's way is above our ways, I got it even though I did not go to church. So, it does not mean you would not get it if you stay away from church."



Sis Siew Choo understands that the church has put in place numerous measures to protect our members - we only have to do our part by observing our own personal hygiene, wash hands diligently and keep masks on at all times, and to commit the rest to the Lord, the Lord will protect us. Amen!

Bangladeshi Vigant Workers Ministry (BMW Ministry)

When the construction of the Thomson-East Coast MRT line began right outside our church walls, we saw an opportunity to serve and forge relationships with the many migrant workers. This was how the Bangladeshi Migrant Workers Ministry began.

The relationship with the Bangladeshi Migrant Workers gave us great insight into their needs during the COVID-19 pandemic. We were able to respond to those needs through the generosity of church members who donated much-needed essentials such as cash, masks, clothes and vitamins. Our young adults also rose to the occasion by helping to pack and distribute these essentials during the circuit breaker at the SG Accident Help Centre (SGAHC), as well as assisted with food distribution.

We were also able to work with SGAHC to provide support to migrant workers with physical injuries that have rendered them unable to work. Once this happens, they are usually sent home without much income or compensation. Whilst most of them look forward to returning home, they are saddled with worries over losing their source of income.

To aid these migrant workers, COS blesses them with a financial gift of \$300 as a gesture of appreciation of their contribution towards our nation-building. To-date, we have been able to bless approximately 60 such migrant workers who received this gift with much thankfulness and happiness. This money will go a long way in helping to defray the cost of some of their needs when they return home.

Before the pandemic, we were able to organise large-scale outreach events for the migrant workers of Samsung C&T Corporation, who were constructing the MRT line right outside our church. It was only after the easing of safety measures that we were able to bless 370 workers during Christmas 2021 with a lunchbox, gift vouchers and handcrafted greeting cards made by the children from Tung Ling Student Care Centre. Several of them shared that they sent pictures of the greeting card to their families back home. They were happy to know that we had not forgotten them.

Through our continued outreach and work in our BMW Ministry, COS is glad to be able to make an impact in the lives of our migrant workers!

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! It is a joy to be able to share with our COS family the ministry in Myanmar Service. We currently hold Worship Services, Bible study sessions and other activities in COS and Peninsular Plaza. These are mostly attended by blue-collared workers employed as domestic helpers or in construction companies.

Since the start of the pandemic, attendance has become highly erratic as employers are concerned with the movement of their employees for fear of them contracting COVID-19. Keeping in touch was also difficult as access to their mobile phones is limited and their contact numbers change frequently due to the use of pre-paid mobile services. Moreover, it is not uncommon for them to be sent home at short notice.

Despite these challenges, we continue to hold weekly activities and connect with those we are

able to contact through texts and mediations. Through these efforts, we hope to be able to build them up in their spiritual maturity so that they too will be able to minister to others while they are here in Singapore and when they return to Myanmar.

The ongoing military coup in Myanmar has also affected the local Burmese community. But God is able to use all things for His glory. We have had many coming to see us for counselling which gives us the opportunity to minister to those who are believers and share the gospel with those who are non-believers. In this way, we are able to draw nearer to God as a community.

In my family, my mother was the last person to accept Christ as she was very resistant to the Gospel. She warned us on many occasions to refrain from telling her about Jesus for she was a devout Buddhist who believed in idol and ancestor worship.

For years, my husband and I prayed for her salvation. In 2020, I started feeling desperate about her salvation and pleaded with God to make something happen. Little did I know that God had already devised a plan and a future for my mother.

In November 2020, my mother was diagnosed with third-stage lung cancer. In December 2020, things took a turn for the worse when she fainted during a routine morning exercise session with her friends. She was taken to the hospital in a semi-coma state.


When I visited her that afternoon, I asked her if

she'd like to know Jesus and to indicate 'yes' by waving her hands. Although she did not open her eyes, she responded by moving her right hand up and down! I led her in praying the sinners' prayer and though she could not speak audibly, I could see her lips moving as she repeated it after me. Not fully convinced that she had accepted salvation, I asked my brother to pray with her again when her eyes were open. This time, she waved her hands and shook her legs! Hallelujah!

Though she recovered partially from this incident, she was unable to remember much of her past. Despite this, we are thankful to see that she is able to raise both hands and regain mobility with the aid of a walking frame. She also regained a healthy appetite and started spending time to listen to hymns.

However, this did not last long. In March 2021, she began to become very drowsy, sleeping up to 20 hours a day, gradually losing the ability to walk, talk or eat. But praise the Lord, she consented to being baptised and we were able to baptise her by the sprinkling of water.

On 1st September, 2021, I went to the doctor to have a neck ultrasound and a biopsy was performed using a fine needle. Based on the biopsy results, the doctor advised that I would be needing surgery - there was a 30% chance that the tumour was malignant.

The doctor gave me a week to discuss my illness with my family. At the same time, I was also praying to God; my children have grown up, my mission on earth has been accomplished and I was feeling very tired. However, can the Lord Jesus allow us to be negative?

At this time, a group of friends surrounded me like angels, praying for me and introducing me to doctors. I have a friend whose husband is a retired specialist, and I showed him the report. He advised me to go for the surgery and advised me to remove the right thyroid gland.

With the recommendation from another friend, I went to see a private specialist doctor. Thank God, the doctor is a Christian. He also advised that I should remove my right thyroid gland. I immediately decided to have surgery. On October 14th, Thursday, at 4 pm, the operation was performed to remove the right thyroid gland. The operation was considered incomplete as the doctor needed to do further testing on my tumor to see if it was malignant. If it was, I would need another operation right away.

4 days later, I was informed by the doctor joyously that I could be discharged - I remembered that it was a Sunday. It was also that same day when a long-lost sister called me with her first words being, "Sister, I would like to pray for you. God is indeed amazing. Throughout your ordeal, He was present, paving the way for you. Glory to the Lord."

Her health continued downhill and in the same week of her baptism, my mother became unresponsive and had to be admitted to the hospital on 11 April 2021. The next day would be the last time I saw her awake. On that day, together with Sis Siew Yeh (Mandarin Service), we prayed and worshipped God and my mother responded by making a thank you gesture with her hands. She was called home to be with the Lord on 17 April 2021.
