COS was founded in 1963 through a great outpouring mission points and churches are established in the of the Holy Spirit at work in Singapore and Malaysia! surrounding countries as we embark on missions.

In the 60's, God led a Hong Kong famous actress, the late Kong Duen Yee and her team to hold evangelistic and revival meetings across Singapore and Malaysia. The Holy Spirit worked mightily, bringing many people, including gangsters, to repent of their sins. Believers were filled with the Holy Spirit, spiritual lives were renewed, and they began to preach the gospel fervently and serve the Lord! Church of Singapore was founded in this wave of revival!

At the time of being founded, there were about sixty to seventy people. As members loved the Lord passionately, they shared the gospel; realising their call to be a royal priesthood, they served and the church grew rapidly to more than a few hundred. In 1978, "Home Fellowship" was formed. Brothers and sisters were assigned to meet in small groups on weeknights according to their respective residential areas. Leaders and assistant leaders of the groups are responsible for pastoring their group members, leading them in evangelism and bringing people to the Lord!

Over the past 60 years, our church has valued ministry to all ages very highly, from children, to youth, to young working adults, to services of various languages, to life groups, to seniors. Multifaceted ministries were also established to serve many others. Responding to the Lord's Great Commission,

mission points and churches are established in the surrounding countries as we embark on missions. The church belongs to God, it is the family of the living God, it is therefore a complete and perfect family church!

The church realises that in the past few years, God has brought various foreign ethnic groups to Singapore, and has brought the mission marketplace to our doorstep. The church has seized the opportunity to reach out to and serve them, to preach the gospel of grace to them and to hold services for them in their own language! Thanks be to the Lord!

In the past 60 years, the Church has gone through different generations, and because of the humble service of the leaders, this servanthood attitude has been passed on, and that is the reason that the Church continues to function and develop steadily! Pray that God will raise up a new generation of leaders in each generation who are willing to surrender themselves and serve in humility!

The present state of the world tells us that the Day of the Lord's return is near. God's people will lift their heads, because the day of redemption is near. We must strive to share the gospel to bring people to Christ and make them disciples of the Lord!

Congratulations on our 60th anniversary, let us continue to serve together and strengthen our family church as we glorify the Name of the Lord!

Uniting GENERATIONS WORKSHOP

In our next step on our journey of "Uniting Generations", the church leadership recognised the necessity of further equipping ourselves. Though the different generations within COS have been coexisting and sharing a common space happily, we believe that more can be done to build a truly intergenerational church.

Intergenerational ministry occurs when a congregation intentionally combines the generations together in mutual serving, sharing, or learning within the core activities of the church in order to live out being the body of Christ to each other and the greater community. [GRACEWORKS]

> Hence, we engaged Graceworks, a local Christian agency, to conduct a 3-hour workshop for our church leadership, with the view that we can be more enlightened on the differences between the different generations and to explore areas of potential conflict and convergence. Members from the Elder Board, Exco and Church Staff attended this workshop.

Wei Hao and Soo Inn from Graceworks shared with us the insights which they have gleaned from researching on the characteristics of different generations in Singapore. There were moments of humour, as we learned about the quirks and unique characteristics of each generation. There were also moments of struggle, as we wrestled with some of the areas of conflict that have occurred as a result of the different perspectives and views held by different generational cohorts. It was a valuable learning experience for all our church leaders.

Let us continue to pray for our family church – that all generations may approach one another in humility and love, so that we may build deep and trusting relationships that will ultimately glorify God.

It takes time for a person to attain mental and spiritual maturity and that is not an easy feat; it is a long term plan. Church of Singapore was founded fifty-nine years ago and is celebrating her 60th anniversary this year. Praise the Lord!

Singapore may have one of the best education systems in the world, but our education system has undergone constant changes since its establishment. Even the best education systems in the world are subject to constant changes as the world keeps evolving. For instance, what I was taught in secondary school is now being taught in primary schools today. However, what is taught in the church should not change. While the methods of delivering Christian education have progressed over time, the fundamentals of our faith must remain the same. Our God does not change and His counsel stands forever.

As Christians, we serve the same Lord God. We may differ in our systems of education. Hence, churches in the world may be different from one another because each has her own unique education system. No church can be strong without an education system — that is how significant Christian education is. Christian education goes beyond just educating Christians about Jesus Christ. It aims to mould Christians to become more Christ-like and Christlikeness will develop in us when we cultivate a deep personal relationship with Christ.

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, our Christian education classes were conducted physically, through onsite attendances at classes, seminars and conferences. When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, we adapted by finding alternative ways to pick ourselves up and soar above the COVID-19 cloud.

Today, through online classes, we are reaching a wider audience. Nevertheless, we do not go for numbers, nor do we want it to be superficial. We emphasize in-depth teaching and practical learning. In addition, we are now able to work hand-in-hand with other churches, Bible colleges and parachurch organisations, more than in pre-COVID times. We want to educate and grow our members spiritually via both the physical and online platforms. Christian Education is not just imparting knowledge but making disciples for Christ. We do not want to know Christ ourselves, we want to bring others to know Christ too!

OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH HEALTH TALKS AND SERVICES

So it is with this ethos that Church of Singapore held her inaugural Health Talk on the 16th of October 2022. The program consisted of a series of talks and free consultation by inhouse and guest healthcare professionals spanning different medical specialities like Cardiology, Audiology, Physiotherapy and Orthopaedics, as well as a general health screening segment run by doctors, nurses and other volunteers from the various services.





It was a truly meaningful event as it united volunteers from the church spanning different age groups, services and ministries, putting their skills, effort and time to serve fellow believers as well as members of the community. Feedback from participants was also very positive as they were given advice and even health supplements for their various conditions. Many have requested for future similar health events!



This was another small step towards achieving our aim to be a church without walls, caring for both members of the church as well as the community at large. All glory to Him!

Vietnam Mission Trip

Our almost-a-decade ministry in Ho Chi Minh City has been concentrated on the New Life Church in the Govap district where Pastor Man leads a vibrant church of about 70 members comprising mostly youths and young adults.

Five years ago, in expansion of this call to bring the gospel to the youths of Vietnam, Pastor Man acted in faith to purchase land in the Di An, Binh Duong district which is just outside of Ho Chi Minh City. This is a university district where ten government and international universities are situated. Pastor Man has a vision of building New Life II, a Centre of Faith where the gospel message can reach out to the thousands of students in those nearby universities.

With God's provision of building funds, construction works on New Life II began in February 2022 and the building was completed in December 2022. During this mission trip, our team was honoured to be part of the dedication service when New Life II was officially opened.

Do uphold Pastor Man and his team in your prayers and we believe that God will open many opportunities for them to share the gospel message to the university students through their ministry and influence at New Life II.

STORIES OF FAITH

IN MEMORY OF La Constant KWAI FONG

The late Ng Sis Kwai Fong went home to the Lord at 5:30 am on March 11, 2021 at age 93. The late Sis Kwai Fong's demise deeply saddened me. Through this article, I would like to honour her life in Christ.

Sis Kwai Fong and her husband, the late Bro Lee Nam Choon, were originally from Hong Kong. Before coming to Singapore, they were baptised in Hong Kong. Faith Church was their first church in Singapore. In 1981, they came to Church of Singapore (COS) and transferred their membership in 1988. They joined Mandarin Service when we started the Mandarin Service in our church. She was a long-time church member and we used to converse in Mandarin and Cantonese.

Sis Kwai Fong enthusiastically studied God's Word and actively attended Bible classes led by Bro Chao Tien Mee and Bro Chao Tian Kong. She never missed cell group meetings, morning prayers, or sisters' fellowship. Together with some church sisters, she would go witnessing and share the Gospel. Many elderly people were blessed by her homemade soups and red bean dessert. Also, she prayed for those in need. Despite being thrifty, she helped those in need financially.

When Bro Lee was holding a job, Sis Kwai Fong rented her apartment to poor students while she and Bro Lee lived in an old apartment opposite the church. They also tithed faithfully. In 1998, the Sis Guai Fong and her husband moved into a three-room HDB flat in Ang Mo Kio. Since they



had no children or relatives, they bequeathed their entire assets, including the HDB flat, to COS and entrusted the handling of their funeral matters to our church.

Following a fall in October 2010, Sis Kwai Fong moved into a nursing home. COS provided transportation to and from the nursing home to enable her to attend church Services, until she became too weak to come to church. In 2013, Bro Lee was called home to the Lord.

Even with many physical ailments, Sis Kwai Fong maintained high spirits and encouraged us whenever we and other church leaders visited her. When we asked if she remembered us, she always said, "You can forget everything, but you can't forget Jesus." Praise be to God!

We thank God for Sis Kwai Fong's generosity in giving her entire estate to our church! COS was her home, and it was at COS where she gained spiritual maturity. The late Sis Kwai Fong loved God, people, and the Church. Her legacy is a wonderful example!
