

Although we may forget what's behind us and strive toward what lies ahead, the mighty power of God, His grace, and miraculous works should not be forgotten, much less disregarded. Every aspect of the Lord's grace should be acknowledged...

In the blink of an eye, Church of Singapore (COS) has been around for 60 years. It is the guidance of God's grace that has brought it from non-existence to existence, to flourish and thrive; we will rely on the Lord for strength without ceasing. I joined the COS family in 1972 and witnessed God's great works.

From an "ancient perilous building" to a magnificent and spectacular architecture that is standing today.

Growing Numbers

As the church grew, more space was needed. In 1977, our landlord approached us about becoming the building's major tenant on the condition that the name "Tung Ling" be preserved. As a result, "Tung Ling Kindergarten" was established.

The congregation had approximately 1,000 members by the late 1980s. Our church leaders realized we needed a building. Therefore, land purchase requirements were made to the owners of 145 Marine Parade Road. We finally acquired the freehold land in 1987 with the owners' consent. Praise the Lord!

A new chapter began with the demolition and construction of the old building in 1989. During the period of construction, our meetings were held at Katong Odeon cinema and No. 41 Koon Seng Road. The new building was completed in 1992. With an Ark-styled architecture, our new church building became a landmark on Marine Parade. All glory be to God.

Number of Services

Our first service was in Mandarin-Hokkien, followed by bilingual services in Chinese and English. English and Mandarin services began in 1987. In response to the needs, Hokkien, Cantonese, Youth Ministry, China Ministry, Myanmar, and Filipino services were started. We now offer fifteen services under one roof. There are also Sunday schools and nurseries for children. Across four generations, the elderly and infants worship together, making this a family church. Besides being diverse in generations, Services in many languages are also offered, all under one church building. The Lord is praised!

Church Offering

For 60 years, the church has given the same way. An offering box with a prayer, fully trusting God in His faithfulness and provision. We have been given immeasurably more than we could ask for or imagine, according to His power in us! Today, we testify of God's blessing, with surplus to develop overseas missions, provide support to those in need, and conduct outreach community ministries, starting from the Kindergarten (1977), Community Services, Student Care Centre (1995), St. Luke's Hospital (1996), Elder Care Center (2000), and Counselling Centre (2022). All by God's grace and provision.

Hallelujah to our Jehovah Jireh!

Pastoral Staff

From having no staff members 60 years ago, we have expanded to a dedicated team of 40 individuals supporting various aspects of the church, including pastoral care, administration, finances, maintenance, media, and other ministries. Notably, our staff members are becoming younger, and successors are emerging. While this is a positive trend, our aspirations go beyond the current scenario.

Our earnest hope is to witness a greater influx of young individuals or those called by the Lord into full-time ministry. Let me challenge you directly. Are you willing to respond obediently to the Lord's call, demonstrating your love for Him by taking up the cross?

Bible Camp

In the beginning, we rented school classrooms, combined several desks, rolled out a thin mattress over it and covered it with a quilt and pillows. Everyone stayed in dormitories; there were no single or double rooms.

In the school cafeteria, a cook catered to three meals a day. We were divided into groups to serve meals. Each group cleaned up after meals. In addition, a group of campers kept the dishes clean each day. Those were the days when there were no disposable cutlery or waiters, and we had to do everything by ourselves. There were no complaints, just praise. For subsequent camps, canvas beds were a treat, but everything else remained the same - such as the unforgettable task of washing the toilets - an activity which was fun in itself.

Camp fees were relatively low. It required everyone to work together, from carrying and distributing logistics, to arranging and sorting out various tasks. We worked together as one, coordinating and helping each other out of love without complaining, only giving. Thanks be to God.

After listening to the sermon, everyone would gather at the campsite to pray and seek God. Every camper felt empowered and refocused after camp. I'm reminded of the past as I reminisce about it today.

We have progressed today. Camps now take place in five-star hotels with free meals. In addition, we have more free time to shop, play, eat, and enjoy. What a pleasure! Additionally, we received spiritual nourishment, effectively accomplishing two goals at once. A rest for the body and soul! Thankful indeed! Thankful!

Territorial Expansion

In 1979, Church of Singapore (Balestier) was established, and in 1981, Church of Singapore (Bukit Timah). In 1987, the Church of Singapore (Woodlands) was founded, and in 1996, the Church of Singapore (Harvest). Besides planting churches, our first church planting missionary went to Thailand in 1977. Several mission points have been since set up in Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Myanmar, Vietnam, Cambodia, China, and India.

Our mission is to follow the Lord's footsteps and to fulfil His commission.

Looking Forward

Would you like to see a greater glory? - Go! and make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19-20).

Do you want to see God's presence? - Do! the work of the Lord with a reverent heart. Fear the Lord. Love Him, walk in His statutes, and keep His ways (John 14:21).

Do you want to see Christ? - To live is Christ! (Philippians 1:21). We are to live a life that magnifies Him.

Let us deny ourselves and daily take up our crosses to follow the Lord (Luke 9:23)

Over 60 years, it hasn't been easy. Looking back, we saw predecessors worked hard to help us - they were our role models. God has always been our constant help and support all these years. In another 60 years, the latter glory of His house shall be more glorious than the former (Hag 2:9)!

Let's put our faith in Him! Let us continue to count His grace.

The 60th Anniversary events were designed around 2 aims in mind: for us to align the church around the various sub-themes of loving God, uniting generations and transforming our communities; as well as to bring our church members to have a sense of belonging around our physical church.

Church of Singapore's 60th Anniversary celebration includes High Praise. As we praise and worship God in three phases: Rejoice, Remember, and Restore, we hope people will experience the faithful presence of God.

Rejoicing: High Praise focuses on praising God's deeds and accomplishments. With joyful and relaxed rhythms, songs celebrate the grace of salvation by taking people back to their first love and joy.

Remembrance: Next, we pause to remember. Others remember highs and lows from their past; some walk a rugged road with difficulty; some have unresolved pain in their hearts; some are exhausted. We are reminded of God's unwavering love and faithfulness through the sharing of two testimonies.

Restoring: God restores His children when they remember Him and are open to Him. His glory is restored in the church and His children's lives are

restored. High Praise ended with hymns of victory and prayer of elders. Through High Praise songs, and testimonies, God's children were touched by His presence.

Worship is powerful; it enables people to give thanks in good times and to be released in times of adversity. Although the world is unpredictable and full of challenges, God's grace is sufficient for His church and children. 29th July 2023's High Praise was not a song and dance performance that stimulated the senses, but a worship and praise session that glorified our Lord, Jesus Christ. The High Praise saw God's children praising our mighty God through worship and praise, and encountering God. All glory to Jesus!

In Mark 16:15-16, Jesus told them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to everyone." Those who believe and are baptised will be saved, but those who reject the gospel will be condemned. For Evangelism Ministry (EM), the key word is "GO" and reflecting on the consequences following these verses is crucial. In order to fulfil His command, we were compelled to act with urgency.

As an action-driven ministry, EM is always on the move. In addition to door-to-door outreach, members of various services have worked tirelessly to love those around us. Food and bread have been distributed at Jalan Kukoh and Marine Terrace respectively. We gathered the elderly at Bukit Merah and Dakota for food, fun, and Bible reading. These are only some of the activities that we have been doing to impact lives for Christ. Supporting lower income families emotionally, physically, and spiritually has opened up many opportunities to reach the lost.



Another area of strength for church is the Alpha course, through which many have turned to Christ and been baptised. With the help of a pool of dedicated ambassadors from our services, we are not only conducting courses, but also grooming new members to serve in Alpha after they have been saved.

Since 2012, street evangelism has been a weekly event. For more than a decade and by God's grace, we have reached countless people on the streets from all walks of life. Besides reaching out to the general public in Punggol, Marine Parade and Chinatown, it also serves as a platform for equipping members to share Christ in a non-confrontational way.

During our door-to-door outreach event on a Good Friday in April 2022, we came across two Vietnamese families living in a rental unit at Jalan Kukoh. Despite having Christian backgrounds, both families lacked fathers. We felt

burdened to provide for the children and adults to grow spiritually. With the help of a Vietnamese sister attending our bilingual service, we launch the first weekly gathering on the 5th of July 2023. Being Vietnamese herself, she understood the need to reach out and support these families. A shop unit within their home ground was used for the meeting. Nine Vietnamese adults and seven children attended the gathering. Praise the Lord!

A few sisters from other churches took care of the children as we gathered. All of us worked together like a big family with a Kingdom mindset. We have an average of 5-6 adults and 6-7 children attending each gathering. We were blessed to have much support from local church members and encouraging turnout.

This Vietnamese gathering also drew people from the community and became a blessing to them such as leading a sister from China to Christ! She was brought to the gathering by her daughter, who is a classmate of a girl from a Vietnamese family. She received Christ as her personal Lord and Savior after more than two months of regular attendance. Glory be to God!

Each week, the attendees have a great time bonding through Vietnamese home-cooked meals prepared by one of the members. Our focus is bonding over dinner in a "family-like" setting. The children look forward to coming together and some found meaning in this broken world by learning about God's love. We hope to nurture adult attendees in their walk with God and provide opportunities to serve Him. Our prayers are that more neighbours in the community will join our weekly gathering!

In this troubled world, there is an urgency in the body of Christ to bring the love of God to many who are in need of a "Great Shepherd." It is your opportunity to make a difference. We are constantly seeking support in all our evangelistic efforts. Are you willing to step out of your comfort zone to harvest for the Lord?

MissionTogether 2023

This year, as Church of Singapore celebrates our 60th Anniversary, the Missions Committee organised a wide range of programmes and activities to commemorate our church's active involvement and commitment to mission work since its early founding days. The theme for this year's Missions Month was "Missions Together; Being PROactive in Missions" - where P-Prayer, R-Relationships, O-Opportunities.

The Missions Committee had hoped for our church members to pray together in unity where mission work is concerned; to build strong and lasting relationships with our church's missionaries and our brothers and sisters from our overseas churches; and to discover fresh opportunities for everyone to serve in missions.

We invited 23 of our church's missionaries from 11 of our mission points overseas across 8 countries to Singapore to celebrate Missions Month together with us. Many of them had never been to Singapore before and this trip was a precious opportunity for them to visit Church of Singapore which has been faithfully supporting their ministry in their home countries.

We also organised a two-day retreat for our church's missionaries at chalets in Changi where they got to enjoy a time of physical rest, spiritual refreshment, enjoying delicious local food, as well as bonding and fellowshipping with all the other missionaries that our church supports.

Over two weekends when our church's missionaries were with us in Singapore, they shared their stories and testimonies during the Sunday services about the good work and ministry activities that were being done in their home churches and encouraged our



congregational members to support their ministries by praying for them and visiting them on a mission trip.

Pastors KyungNam and KyungA Park, the international directors of the mission agency WEC International, and Pastor Shane Comiskey, the executive missions director of a local church, Victory Family Centre, led missions-focused workshop sessions with our church congregation to excite our members to go for mission trips, and also conducted focus-group sessions with our church's missionaries during their two-days retreat.

We thank God that this has been an exciting Missions Month for many church members who got to interact with our missionaries; and for our missionaries as well in being able to physically worship with us in Singapore and to celebrate our church's 60th Anniversary and firm continued commitment to mission work.

In partnership with Salt&Light, a Christian online article site, "UG Cards" was recently featured in an article that included a giveaway, enabling us to reach believers from over 50 churches. To increase accessibility, "UG Cards" is also now available at Christian retail stores.

I've prayed for the leading of the Holy Spirit guide participants to select the cards

most relevant to them, enabling them to open up and connect on a profound level I had not witnessed before. The feedback from all participants has been overwhelmingly positive. The objective was to build trust with them and it worked. I would also like to highlight that these cards played a significant role in reconciling my relationship with my family. It has become clear to me that we all share a fundamental desire to love and be loved, to feel engaged, to feel validated and honoured, regardless of our unique attributes. The passage from Hebrews 10:24-25 comes to mind, urging us to consider how we may encourage one another to love and do good deeds, emphasising the importance of gathering together.

I firmly believe that these "UG Cards" are among the most interactive and powerful tools for outreach that have ever been invented. They have the potential to be embraced by anyone and are a remarkable means of fostering connection and understanding among people and helping to raise mental health awareness across different generations.
