

Stepping to Steppi **Catching the Vision**

As we draw near to the end of the year, we give thanks for how God has led us through our church theme, "It's Harvest Time! Let's Go." This theme has been more than a call to gather the harvest—it has been a call to put our faith into action, to step out, serve others, and allow God to work through us.

Our church theme carries three subthemes: Catch the Vision, Stand in the Gap, and Make a Difference. By now, many of us would have understood what it means to catch the vision, where the gaps are that we are called to stand in, and how we can make a difference in our community. As we reflect on this past year, may we once again align our hearts with God's mission—seeing what Jesus saw, feeling what He felt, and doing what He calls us to do.

CATCH THE VISION

STAND IN THE GAP



MAKE A DIFFERENCE

In Matthew 9:35-38, we read that Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, Jesus was moved with compassion, for they were lost and helpless-like sheep without a shepherd. Humanity remains in that same condition today, in need of the Good Shepherd who laid down His life for the lost.

What moves you and me when we see our relatives, neighbours, colleagues, classmates, and friends who are still lost without the saving grace of Jesus? We must catch the same vision that moved the heart of Jesus. Without compassion for the lost, we will not have the burden or zeal to stand in the gap and reach them. To catch the vision is to see what Jesus saw-and to feel what He felt for those far from God.

Where, then, is the gap?

The gap may be in your own family, where someone has yet to believe in Jesus. It could be in your neighbourhood, where a neighbour is in need of the Saviour's love. It might be in your workplace or school, where a colleague or classmate has yet to know Christ. Who will stand in the gap for them? The answer is simple-you and me.

When you first came to faith, someone stood in the gap for you. Now, the question is-who will you stand in the gap for?

Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." When He said "plentiful," He meant that many are ready to receive the gospel. But the workers are few-not because there are too few followers of Jesus, but because not all are reporting for duty. Too many are secret, silent, or sleeping Christians.

Jesus calls us to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest field. That includes you and me. As we pray and obey, we go as His witnesses. Praise the Lord that many in COS have already stood in the gap-praying for names on their blessing cards and inviting them to our outreach events.

How can we be effective witnesses for Christ?

Jesus made a difference in every town and village He entered by proclaiming the good news and healing the sick. Likewise, we can make a difference in our homes, neighbourhoods, schools, and workplaces by living out the love of Christ, meeting needs, and sharing the good news that brings peace and hope.

You and I were once lost like sheep without a shepherd—until someone stood in the gap for us and shared the gospel. As Romans 10:13-15 reminds us, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." But how can they believe unless someone tells them? And Acts 1:8 declares that we will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon us, to be witnesses from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth.

Let us therefore go forth with the compassion of Jesus and the power of

the Holy Spirit—to stand in the gap between the living and the dead, and to make a difference by bringing the hope of Christ to our land.

From Personal Encounter to Harvest Action

The Annual Bible Camp (ABC) has always been more than just a yearly retreat—it's a sacred space where the COS family gathers to encounter God afresh, be renewed by His Spirit, and be sent out to serve in His harvest field.

This year's theme, "God, You Alone I Seek," called us to return to the heart of worship and intimacy with God. As we sought Him earnestly, many experienced transformation—both inwardly and outwardly. For when we truly encounter Him, we are not the same; our hearts are stirred to live out our faith in tangible ways, to love, serve, and reach the lost.

Encounter That Transforms

One such testimony came from Susan Tan, who encountered the Lord in a deeply personal and powerful way during camp. Having lived for years with a congenital heart murmur that caused breathlessness and chest pain, she experienced complete healing during one of the ministry sessions.

Susan, "I was so immersed in God's presence that I didn't even realise the ministry time had ended," she shared. "On the final night, I felt prompted by the Holy Spirit to run. Though hesitant, I obeyed—and to my amazement, I ran without pain. It was truly a miracle."

Today, Susan continues to testify of her healing, able to brisk walk pain-free for 30–40 minutes daily. Beyond physical restoration, she speaks of a deeper spiritual renewal: "God is still shaping and preparing me. I often pray, 'Lord, You are the potter, I am the clay. Mold me, shape me into the person You want me to be."

These encounters are seeds of revival that continue to bear fruit in our community.

As we look ahead, may we continue to see each Annual Bible Camp as a divine appointment—an opportunity to seek God's face, hear His voice, and be sent out again into His harvest field. When we catch His vision, we are ready to stand in the gap and make a difference in our community.

To every brother and sister seeking breakthrough, healing, or a fresh encounter with God—don't miss next year's camp. Come with an expectant heart. He is faithful, and He will meet you there.

All glory and praise to our Lord Jesus Christ for His healing and transforming work in my life!

I've always looked forward to church camp, but this year was especially significant. During the recent COS Church Camp, I encountered God in a deeply personal and powerful way. Not only was I spiritually refreshed—I also received complete healing from a heart condition I had unknowingly lived with since childhood.

I was born with a congenital heart murmur, which caused breathlessness and recurring chest pain throughout my life. But during this camp, everything changed. On the second night, I was so immersed in God's presence that I didn't even realise the ministry time had ended—until a sister and Lydia came over to pray for me. I felt completely wrapped in His peace and love, as though time had stood still.

On the final night, I had a powerful encounter with the Holy Spirit. Trembling under His presence, I sensed a prompting to run. Though hesitant, I obeyed—and to my amazement, I ran around the hall without any pain. It was truly a miracle. Back in Singapore, I now brisk walk 30–40 minutes daily—completely pain-free. Hallelujah!

Beyond physical healing, God renewed my spirit and deepened my surrender to Him. I often pray: "Lord, You are the potter, I am the clay. Mold me, shape

me into the person You want me to be."

"Yet You, Lord, are our Father. We are the clay, You are the potter; we are all the work of Your hand." — Isaiah 64:8 (NIV)

I'm deeply grateful to Pastor Godwin Shim, the camp committee, worship team, and Sister Dorothy for their Spirit-led ministry and obedience to God's call.

A total of 158 children attended the event, and we thank God for the 44 newcomers, including several non-believers. Teachers also took the chance to share the Good News, and we thank God for His grace in every conversation and encounter.

We also saw God's hand at work in the planning process. Despite a short runway, He provided a venue close to church and gave us favour with the owners, who extended a further discounted rate. Even the goody bags, which faced delays in shipment, arrived perfectly on time. Every detail pointed to God's perfect timing and faithfulness.

Through this outing, we witnessed how God is doing something new in the way we reach, teach, and disciple children. Beyond Sunday lessons, the experience reminded us that discipleship can happen anywhere—through laughter, play, and shared moments of joy. Every child is a vessel for God's purpose. The Power of a Praying Church

When Jesus declared, "My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations" (Mark 11:17; cf. Isaiah 56:7), He reminded us that the church is called to be more than a place of gathering. But COS is called to be a House of Prayer. We took flight with faith since our founding, let our prayer be the other wing that will help us soar on high for our Lord. Let us put our faith into action through corporate praying, for faith even as small as a mustard seed, can move mountains (Matthew 17:20).

The Prayer Pointers project was birthed with this conviction. It provides a practical and intentional way for us to lift our hearts in intercession—for our church, our community, our nation, and for one another.

60 Cyclists, 60km for SG60! - Church of Singapore Rides in Unity to Celebrate the Nation's 60th Birthday



National Day spirit was in full gear as more than 70 cycling enthusiasts from COS gathered on 9 August 2025 for a meaningful ride — 60 cyclists cycling 60km for SG60!

It was the first-ever COS cycling event to mark National Day, and the excitement was contagious. Members from different services and generations invited family and friends to join in, turning the morning into a lively celebration of faith, fellowship, and love for the nation.





Flagging off from COS at 7.00am, cyclists rode along scenic routes in both directions — eastward toward Changi Airport and westward to Marina Barrage — stopping at key points to pray for Singapore. Prayers were lifted for our nation's security, economy, and for the churches in Singapore to continue shining as the Antioch of Asia.

"This event truly showcased our unity and spirit as a church and as a nation!" shared Joshua Teo, Deacon, who led the initiative. "God protected every cyclist and blessed us with beautiful weather. Most of all, His glory was seen in the love and care everyone showed — no one was left behind."

As the riders returned, tired but joyful, one thing was clear — this was more than just a cycling event. It was faith in motion, a heartfelt thanksgiving for 60 years of God's faithfulness over Singapore.

When the COVID-19 pandemic began, and churches were unable to gather, many of us were asking: How do we continue loving and serving others when doors are shut and distance keeps us apart? For some of us, what we had was a kitchen. And from that kitchen, a ministry was born.



How Taste & See Began

Taste & See started in June 2020 as a Church of Singapore (COS) interest group. A small group of us began meeting on Zoom to cook and bake together from our homes. What began as fellowship soon became faith in action.

We partnered with COS Local Missions to bless low-income families in Jalan Kukoh with home-baked treats. Later, through SG Cares, we extended support to migrant workers living in dormitories—many far from home and loved ones. Even a simple muffin or cookie carried warmth, dignity, and the message: *You are seen. You are not forgotten*.

Over the years, Taste & See has had the privilege of supporting church-wide and community initiatives, including:



I highlighted to join as part time for the season as I am still in the midst of transitioning back to Singapore and more so having the free time to accommodate to my very frequent medical follow ups at SGH. All glory to God and can't wait to see all the good things He has in store for me and the millennials!
